BEST PRACTICES AND REQUIREMENTS FOR BIOMETRIC PHOTOS



too close



too far away





ink marked/creased



Photograph quality

The photographs must be:

- no more than 6-months old
- 35—40mm in width
- close up of your head and top of your shoulders so that your face takes up 70-80% of the photograph
- in sharp focus and clear
- of high quality with no ink marks or creases

Style and lighting

be colour neutral

across your eyes

show you facing square on to the camera, not

looking over one shoulder (portrait style) or tilted, and showing both edges

The photographs must:

show your eyes open and clearly visible—no hair



blurred



eyes closed



hair across eyes



portrait style



eyes tilted



not centred





be taken with a plain

of your face clearly

light-coloured background

be taken with uniform lighting and not show shadows or flash reflections on your face and no red eye



busy background





flash reflection on skin



redeye



shadows behind head



shadows across face





wearing a hat



wearing a cap







face covered



shadows across face



shows another person mouth open and toy too close to face



Head coverings:

are not permitted except for religious reasons, but your facial features from bottom of chin to top of forehead and both edges of your face must be clearly shown.

Expression and frame

Your photographs must:

show you alone (no chair backs, toys or other people visible), looking at the camera with a neutral expression and your mouth closed.
